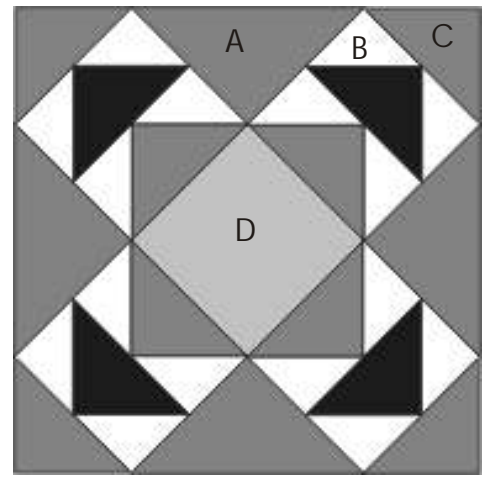


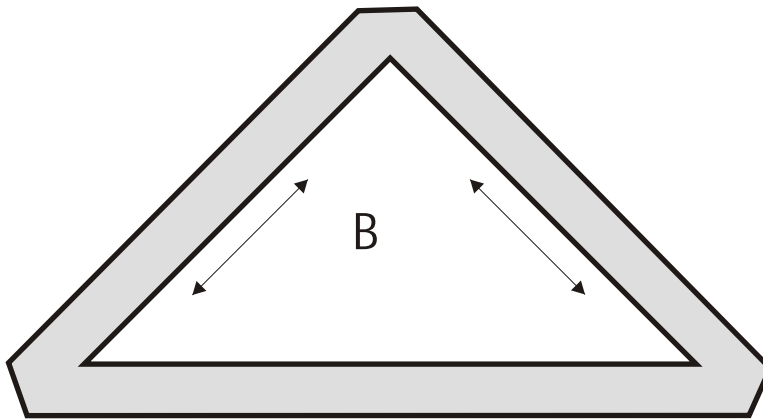

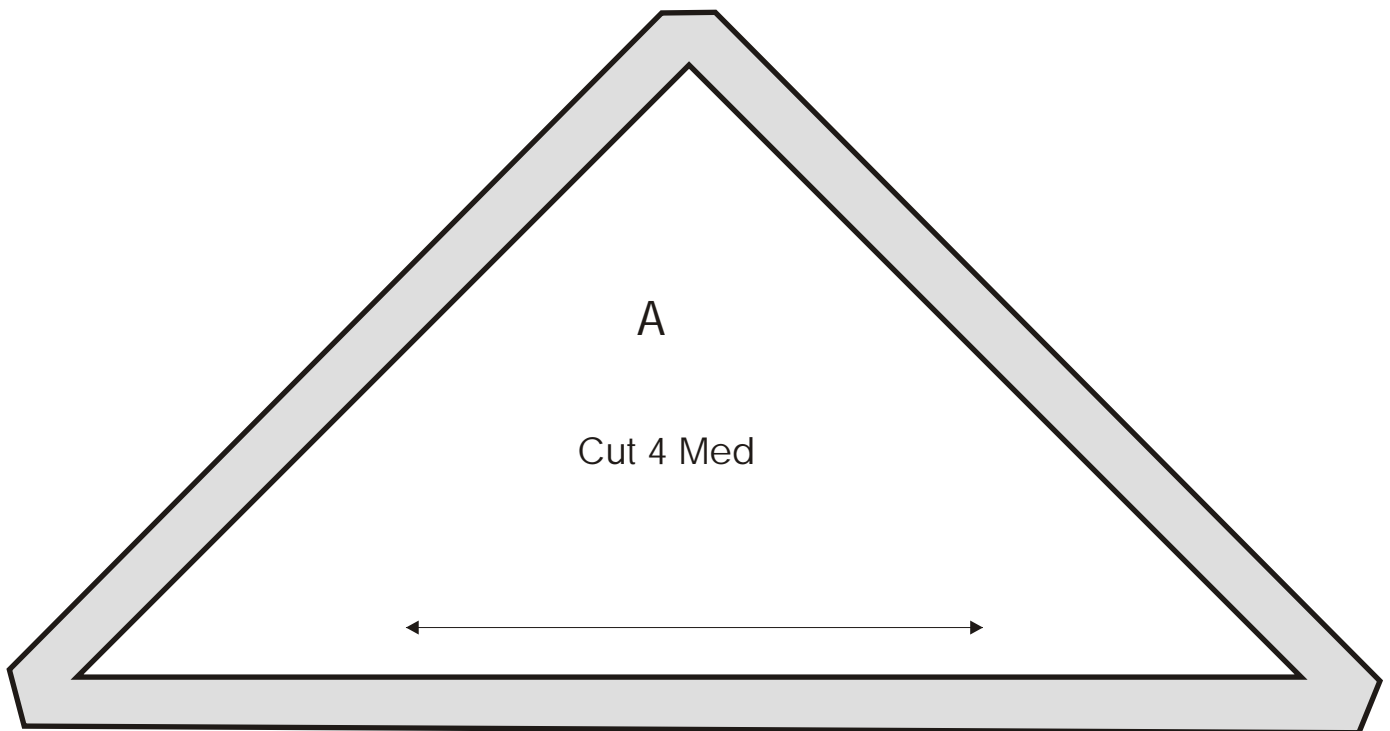
Note: Arrows indicate where the straight grain of fabric should be when placing templates. If there aren't any arrows use the written notes for layout instructions.



12 Inch Block

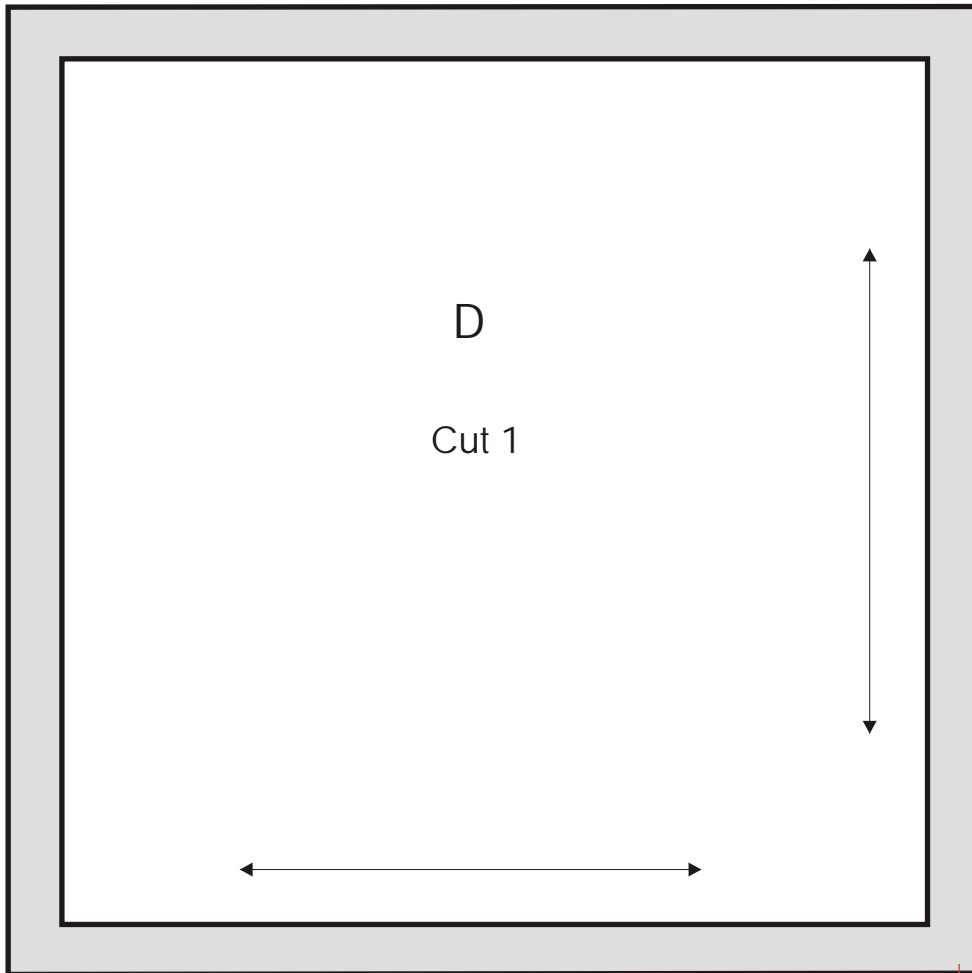
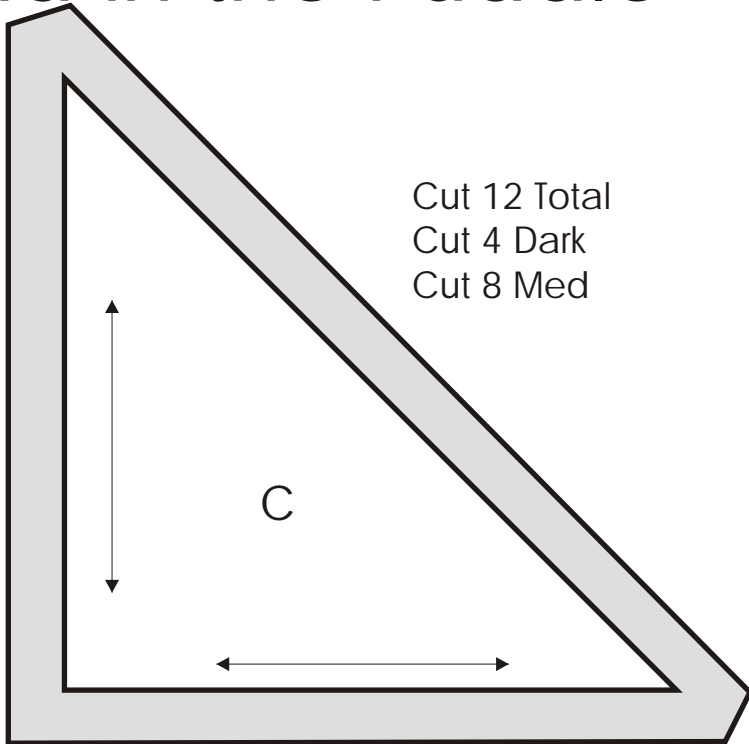


Cut 16 Light

Assembly Instructions

Make your templates, you can either make them with the 1/4 seam allowance included or without. I prefer without. Or you can make 2 sets of templates one with the seam allowance and one without.

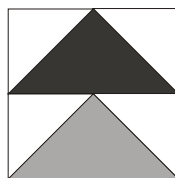
Mark and cut the number of pieces of each unit as noted on each template. Watch your grain lines.

- 4 of - A - in Med. fabric
- 16 of - B - in a light fabric
- 4 of - C - in a Dark fabric
- 8 of - C - in a Medium fabric
- 1 of - D - in a Med light fabric

Assemble the block by first piecing all of the flying geese units. These units use 1 of the - C - triangles with 2 of the smaller - B - triangles. There are 8 units to assemble, use the 4 Dark - C - triangles and 4 of the Mediums.



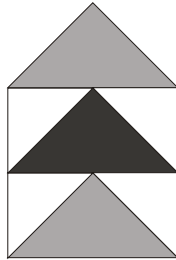
When you have the 8 units pieced, group them in 4 pairs of geese units where you have one of the Dark - C - triangle with one of the Medium - C - triangles. Then piece the sub-unit so that the Dark - C - Triangle is above the Medium unit as shown:



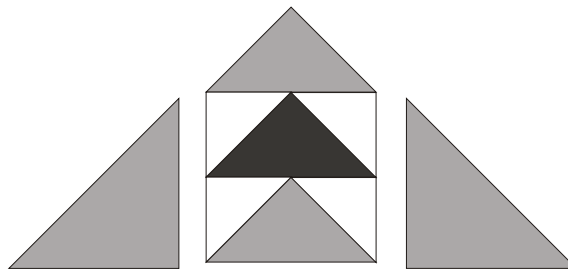

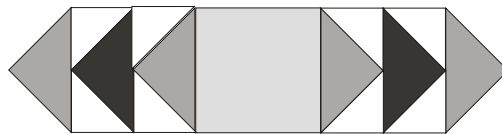
Sew the remaining Medium - C - triangles to the top of these geese pairs.



Take one of the above sub-units and sew 2 - A - units to this, one on each side, making a large triangle assembly. Make two of these triangles.



Next sew the 2 remaining geese units to the - D center square .

The final assembly is to sew the two triangles to the center strip. This completes the Block.
